From our Director.....

This is the first play I have directed and I would like to thank The Aldershot Players for this opportunity to "cut my teeth."

From the point of view of an actor, I used to think that putting a play together was like preparing certain kinds of meals. The ingredients look vaguely unappetizing to begin with -- disagreeable, even, in the case of stewing lamb -- but with the passage of time and a bit of culinary know-how a miraculous transformation occurs and ... well, lamb curry is one of my favourites. That said, my experience from the Director's chair has been somewhat different. I have been working with a group of talented and enthusiastic people since August and have never been in any doubt that it would be through their work, plus Ken Ludwig's hilarious script, that a worthwhile and enjoyable evening's entertainment would result. Indeed, it is difficult to imagine how different the result would be if any one of them had been replaced by someone else. More like venison tenderloins braised in amontillado.

Opera is not a very popular medium of entertainment here in Canada but I think you will find that at the end of the day, its exponents and enthusiasts have the same high and low motives, and feelings about shrimp cocktail, as the rest of us.

Next time I write program notes I think I'll do it on a full stomach.

## The Cast Biographies:

### **Andrew Huisman -- Max**

This is Andrew's fourth production with The Aldershot Players and his biggest role to date. You might remember him from his last role with TAP in *A Perfect Wedding*. He has also done some work with the Mississauga Italian Canadian Association and with Waterdown Village Theatre. With the exception of Laurel, Andrew is acting with everyone in this cast for the first time and is loving the chemistry the members have with each other. ### **Lisa Southon - Maggie**

This is Lisa's second performance with TAP, after playing Pamela in *Out of Order*. Lisa began training with Theatre Aquarius at the age of 12, and continued with the theatre, both with acting and choreography, in such plays as *Peter Pan* and *Fiddler on the Roof*. ### **Bruce Fleming - Saunders**

This is Laurel's second production at The Aldershot Players and she is thoroughly enjoying getting reacquainted with old friends and meeting some new characters - and what characters they are! Laurel's first part with TAP was the female lead in *Moon Over Buffalo* in 2005 and she was thrilled to win their Best Actress Award. Laurel has played with Hamilton Players' Guild and Village Theatre in Waterdown where she has also volunteered as Publicity Coordinator for several years.

### **Steve Amor - Director**

This is Steve's directorial debut. He has appeared on stage in six productions in the Hamilton area in the last seven years, of which the most recent (and biggest) was as George Pigden in TAP's Spring 2006 Production of *Out of Order*.
